We have perused your telegram No. 12454 dated 17/12/1427 AH which refers to decisions No. 3514 on 03/05/1427 AH and No. 8062 on 11/11/1427 AH, regarding the approval of the establishment of Tabuk, Al-Baha and Najran universities.

We have perused your telegrams No. 10336 dated 13/10 /1427 AH and No. 10436 dated 14/10 /1427 AH.

The telegrams notify us that university colleges in Najran have been turned into an independent University and that the formation of a committee consisted of the Ministry of Higher Education, the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Civil Service is required to oversee the transfer of posts and property as well as recruitment and construction contracts from the owners of King Khalid University to the owners of the new University of Najran.
